

INTRODUCTION

The Colloquy is a chic retreat for a family celebration, university reunion or a big birthday. It also provides a contemporary location for corporate retreats, board meetings, management courses and executive training. Beyond the Colloquy's own garden there are 700 acres of fields, orchards and woodland for you to wander in: and beyond that, 8000 square miles of Wales, Herefordshire, Shropshire and the Borderlands to explore.

We have tried to provide as much information as possible in this statement, if you have any queries please don't hesitate to ask. We look forward to welcoming you.

PRE-ARRIVAL

We have two websites for you to view www.thecolloquy.com and www.whiteheronproperties.com All bookings and enquiries can be made via email, phone or fax.

The Colloquy is nearest to Leominster station at about 14 miles; Hereford is around 18 miles and Ludlow around 20 miles. There is a bus service (National Express) to Hereford bus station and a local bus comes to Lyonshall from the same bus station. Shobdon Airfield is approximately 3 miles away.

We offer the facility to hire wheelchairs and other aids and equipment, please ask for prices and details when booking. You can arrange to have shopping delivered to the property when you're there via Tesco home delivery.

ARRIVAL & CAR PARKING FACILITIES

The car park is situated in front of the colloquy and is 6 meters from the main entrance.

There is parking for at least 10 cars at the property.

The entrance at the front has one step-17.9cm high, 28cm deep and 100cm wide. The door is 100cm wide and is hinged from the left.

MAIN ENTRANCE & RECEPTION

Entering the Colloquy through the lower cobbled courtyard there are two main entrances — the first through a travertine marble lower hallway with large stone steps-22.2cm high, 29cm deep and 1000cm wide, into a large sitting area through double doors hinged from both sides and are 115cm wide, with an immediate view up to the upper courtyard and the magnificent clock (still working and wound every Friday - it only strikes during the day so if it is striking in the night please let us know as it will be because there has been a power cut and the time clock may be reading the wrong time). The second entrance is through the original thoroughfare. Now enclosed but formally open this hallway has the original, unusual porcelain wall bricks and stone bricked polished floor. All internal doorways are 2' 9" to 3', and there are differing levels throughout the building with short steps from one room to the next. There is one bedroom with a wet room on the ground floor (Room 7) where wheelchair access is possible, although the user would need some help.

HEATING

The property is heated entirely by a wood chip boiler which is occasionally supplemented by additional gas boiler when the weather is really cold. All downstairs areas have underfloor heating and upstairs the bedrooms have radiators. This has reduced our carbon footprint enormously however we would still ask you too keep the heating at a reasonable level, to keep all doors and windows closed and not to turn the thermostats up to more than 20 degrees as you will still overload the system and we do not have a plumber available at weekends.

TROUBLE SHOOTING - Should the heating not work the hot water can be operated by immersion heaters. All the controls for the heating are found in the boiler room and the three immersion heaters are clearly marked. Please do not fiddle with any other controls for the heating - the only thing that may be worth considering if the heating or hot water is not on is that there may have been a power cut in which case the time clocks may well be set at the wrong time and will need putting back to the correct hour. Please only allow technically competent members of your party to mess about with these!!





PUBLIC AREAS

The sitting room at the top of the hallway steps (Sitting Room I) has two opening casements so access into the courtyard is easy over a long bench seat. This sitting area has a hole-in-the-wall fire and some sink-into sofas with TV and X-box. Some double doors open into the huge dining area and chill zone/cinema.

A second sitting room is situated to the right of Sitting Room I in the old tack room with all the original boards on the wall. You can still make out the shape of the saddle stands on the east facing wall. This houses a second Sky plus TV.

OUTDOOR FACILITIES

The Squash court has its own wc and washing facilities and is accessed from the long south facing terrace through double doors hinged both sides-100cm wide. The squash court itself is unheated so a red spot ball is recommended. Rackets, balls and shoes are provided - please remember indoor shoes only. Our hot-tub, sauna and health room can be found in the Old Potting Shed near the car-parking area up three stone steps. All these facilities may be used free of charge by any of our guests however, you may have to book a slot for some of the above. The Potting Shed is a self-contained, heated area. There are also changing rooms for the outdoor swimming pool which is open between May and end of September. Our swimming pool is fenced off for children's safety and is open between 9am and 8pm daily.

BEDROOMS

All bedrooms have ensuite bathrooms, TV; and independent kitchen areas. All beds are pocket sprung and have 100% Egyptian cotton sheets, with king or super king duvets. Four of the beds are super king; one bedroom has twins - which can be made up as a super king, the remaining three bedrooms have king-size beds. On the lower-ground and ground floor the heating is under floor and on the first floor stunning black Italian efficient radiators. Measurements are approximate:

- **Bedroom I** 20ft by 20ft with set of stairs up to day beds
- Bedroom 2 20ft by 15ft with set of stairs up to single bed and additional pull out bed
- **Bedroom 3** 15ft by 15ft
- **Bedroom 4** 25ft by 20ft
- **Bedroom 5** 15ft by 15ft
- Bedroom 6 20ft by 20ft
- Bedroom 7 20ft by 25ft with set of stairs up to day bed and bath
- **Bedroom 8** Large self contained character cottage with mezzanine double bed and shower/wetroom downstairs, plus kitchen and sitting room plus day bed (full size single) downstairs.





BATHROOMS

All bathrooms have modern taps mostly wall mounted. If there is no shower in the bathroom then there is also a bath shower-head. Towels provided are all bath sheet size. All bathrooms can be entered via a bedroom through standard sized doors 100cm wide.

GROUNDS AND GARDENS

The one hectare walled garden was built in the early 1800s and is a safe-haven for families as it is enclosed and gated on all sides. A well-lit long terrace runs along the south side of the Stables with a larger dining terrace and a gas barbecue on the terrace (gas provided and a spare available from James Moss should you need it). The Swimming pool is protected by a tall ironwork fence which has two gates on it. Both these gates are padlocked and the combination number is 007. The pool is fully heated and is fully maintained throughout the summer months between May and September. It has a constant depth of 1.4 metres and has a tile finish. Chlorine is tested on a daily basis and remedial treatment is applied.

Additional Information

HOUSE RULES AND REMINDERS

- Sauna and hot tub must only be used by adults; or children only under supervision. Please ensure that your children know not to wee in the hot tub. If it has to be emptied you are unlikely to be able to use it again. (see further details below.) Before using the hot tub please remove any make-up or sun oil and please have a shower. (Will you ensure that all members of your party have read the sheet of simple instructions before entering). Please do not allow your children to change any of the settings on the hot tub.
- The Swimming pool is fenced and padlocked is used entirely at your own risk. In any case it must only be used under strict supervision. No running or diving, and please no sitting on the pool roller (again see full details below). Children must not be left alone inside the fenced area. The pool is a uniform 1.4m deep.
- Media Centre. Please do not touch any of the settings on the media centre, either by using the computer or any of the switching equipment. PLEASE do not allow your children to have any of the controllers for this very expensive piece of equipment. Please do not try to plug or unplug any of the leads in the back of the computer. If you want to plug in your i-Pod there is a lead at the front with IPOD clearly marked on it (full details below). Any damages or call out from our computer consultants will be chargeable. There is an instruction sheet by the media centre please read it before firing up! By special arrangement you can use microsoft office for Power Point presentations. Please do not try to access any sex orientated sites we have bars placed on many access words we have many children staying in this property and we would not want them to inadvertently find unsuitable material.
- Sun Awning. Please always wind in when not in use it is not a rain shelter.
- Absolutely no dogs!
- Please drive slowly through our lanes there have been a couple of accidents recently, and there are a lot of children and dogs around the area, not too mention tractors and farm machinery that may damage you! 20 30mph is max speed.
- Please but all your recycling into the large green bins, having rinsed out any tins, bottles or cartons.

 Please leave food that you don't want to eat in the fridge or on the sides in the kitchen if it gets put out there are foxes around! All other waste in black bin liners and put in the large municipal size bin.
- Please report damages, however small then we can replace glasses and crockery as it is broken.
- Do bring your own swimming towels for use in the sauna, hot-tub and swimming pool and your own CDs/DVDs.





- Check out after a week stay or a long weekend is 10am; or 6pm for a two night weekend. Please be responsible for the environment. Do not overheat the house and/or leave all the windows open. Please turn lights off- particularly those for outside and in the garden.
- Remember the refuse collection on a Friday morning at 8.30am at the bottom of the drive. The large municipal bin is also emptied on a Tuesday.
- Remember to include toilet rolls, dishwasher tablets, washing up liquid and washing powder on your shopping list.
- No fireworks or loud parties outside please please be considerate of the several houses in the neighbourhood which includes members of our farm staff who have to get up early in the morning!
